Our trip to Coyolate, Guatemala was an incredible blessing in every way.

The 7-person team that went down to participate in this partnership worked really well together and forged deeper bonds of friendship with one another than we could have anywhere else. I was particularly amazed by the variety of gifts within the members of our team and how well they complemented each other as the trip unfolded. As most of you know, I got pretty sick down there almost from the moment we arrived – a combined throat and ear infection that resisted antibiotics and limited my effectiveness as both a worker and a leader. But the way my six teammates stepped up made my limitations become nearly invisible.

Similarly, another member of our team, Hagen Manker, had real difficulty with the 94-degree temperatures in which we were working. While he may not have been able to work as much as he'd hoped, Hagen is the only one of us who is truly fluent in Spanish; it was the primary language of the family in which he was raised. Hagen's language skills more than made up for the manual labor he wasn't able to do. We were a true team in every sense of the word.

One of the greatest blessings of the trip was the relationships we were able to forge with the Guatemalans at the work site. Oscar, Joelle, Lorenzo, Elias, and Tomas were so easy and fun to work with. Despite a certain level of language barrier, we all managed to communicate effectively. The fact that they were laughing during the majority of our workdays was a testament to how much they enjoyed being with us. Ruth, Marieya, and Doris – our cooks throughout the week – were equally wonderful and so attentive to our every need.

From the Pastor (cont'd)

The tiny community health clinic, which stands at the center of this remote rural village, was a place where at least half our team spent significant amounts of time dealing with our various maladies. Ingrid, the head nurse, Wendy, the pharmacist, and Marisol, the nurse assistant, were incredibly gracious about seeing and evaluating us, making sure to get us the medications we needed. I do wish someone had videotaped the “conversation” I had with Ingrid – who speaks zero English – as she attempted to convey to me that what I needed was a big shot in my butt. Some gestures are truly universal. I will say that there is no better motivation to get better at a language than to be sick and under the care of a health professional who speaks no English. Duolingo, here I come!

One of the highlights of the trip was the day I wandered over to the Elementary school during recess and challenged some of the kids to a soccer game. The few student leaders I was talking to kept asking me how many players I had on my team, and I kept reiterating “Ocho...Ocho.” (Eight). I asked them to pick their 8 players and meet us at the center of the field. They showed up with just shy of a hundred kids, who insisted on all being on the field at once. Not only were we severely outnumbered, but somewhere in the first half of the game, the kids decided that having two balls on the field simultaneously would double the fun. Despite my protestations – and here my language skills were more than sufficient – we wound up taking on all one-hundred of them with two balls flying all over the pitch. It was a total blast, but in the 94-degree heat, the eight of us withered pretty quickly and limped back to our worksite next door.



On Wednesday evening, we were invited to participate in a worship service at the little Presbyterian church that serves the village, a church that Tomas and Healthy Communities helped establish and build. Coincidentally, the interior of this church is decorated with purple shrouds and swaths of cloth, making us feel right at home. Our group was introduced, and we sang “Until All Are Fed” as a part of the service. I was given the opportunity to preach and focused my remarks on the trajectory of shepherding in the Bible. I finished the message by playing and singing Johnny Cash’s version of



“Bridge Over Troubled Water.” We were all so well received. At the conclusion of the service, literally every person in the congregation came up and warmly hugged each member of our team. It was a powerful experience of Christian community, which runs across all cultural, linguistic, and economic differences.



In the end, we finished roofing, walling, and completely closing in the kitchen and attached bathrooms for the new pre-school. During our final day on the site, the kids from the existing pre-school came over with their teacher to see their new school, kitchen, and bathrooms that they will soon move into. They were super excited and tremendously grateful. Gerber has promised to send us pictures on the day they officially move across the street from their old classroom to their new one.



During the entirety of this powerful experience of partnership, the seven of us were profoundly aware that it was YOU – our church family – who made this entire partnership trip possible. Your prayers, your donated suitcases, school supplies, and medical supplies, along with your generous financial gifts made this an all-church endeavor. I am so thankful and so proud to be a part of 1st Congregational United Church of Christ in Charlevoix. God is so good.

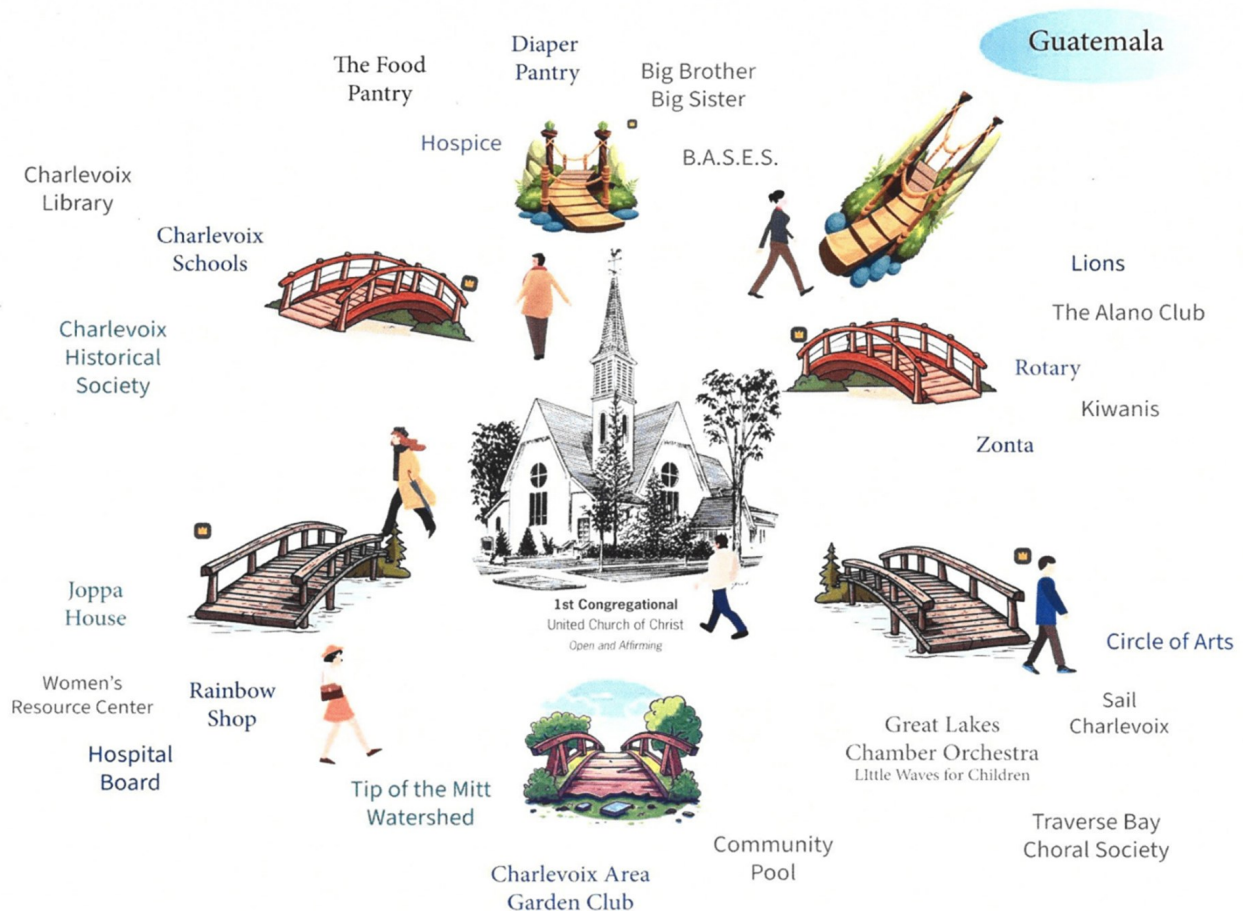


From Reaching Out...
