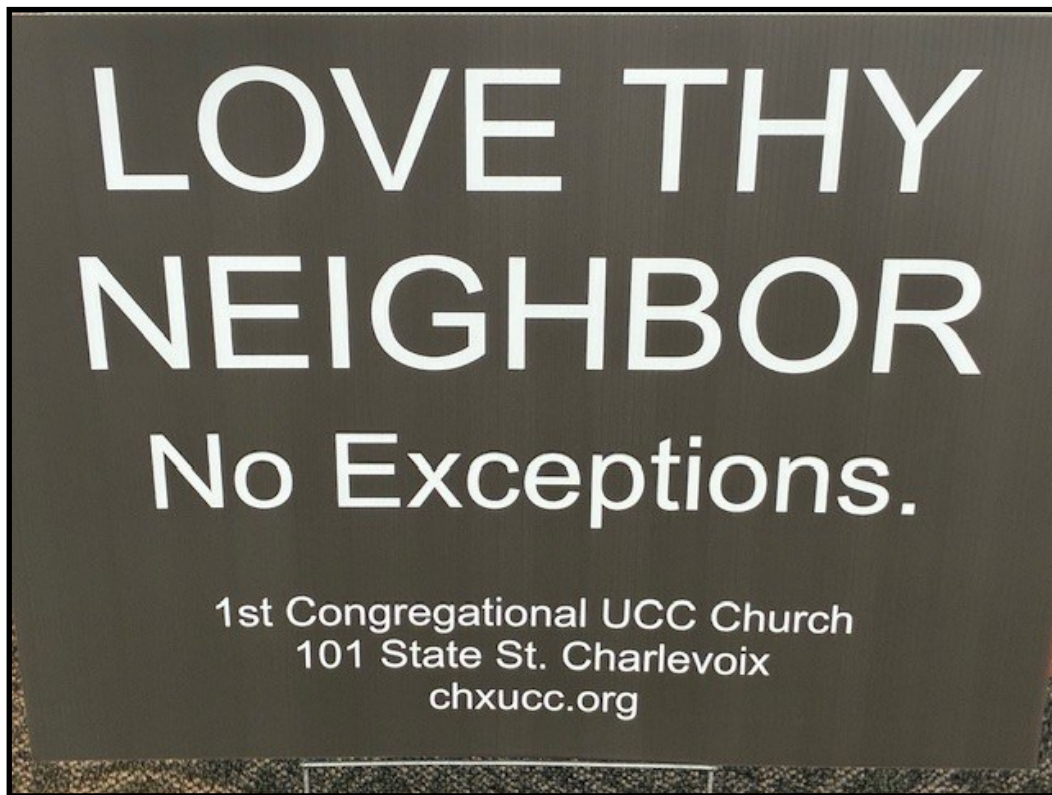

Thank You for Supporting the CROP Hunger Walk!!

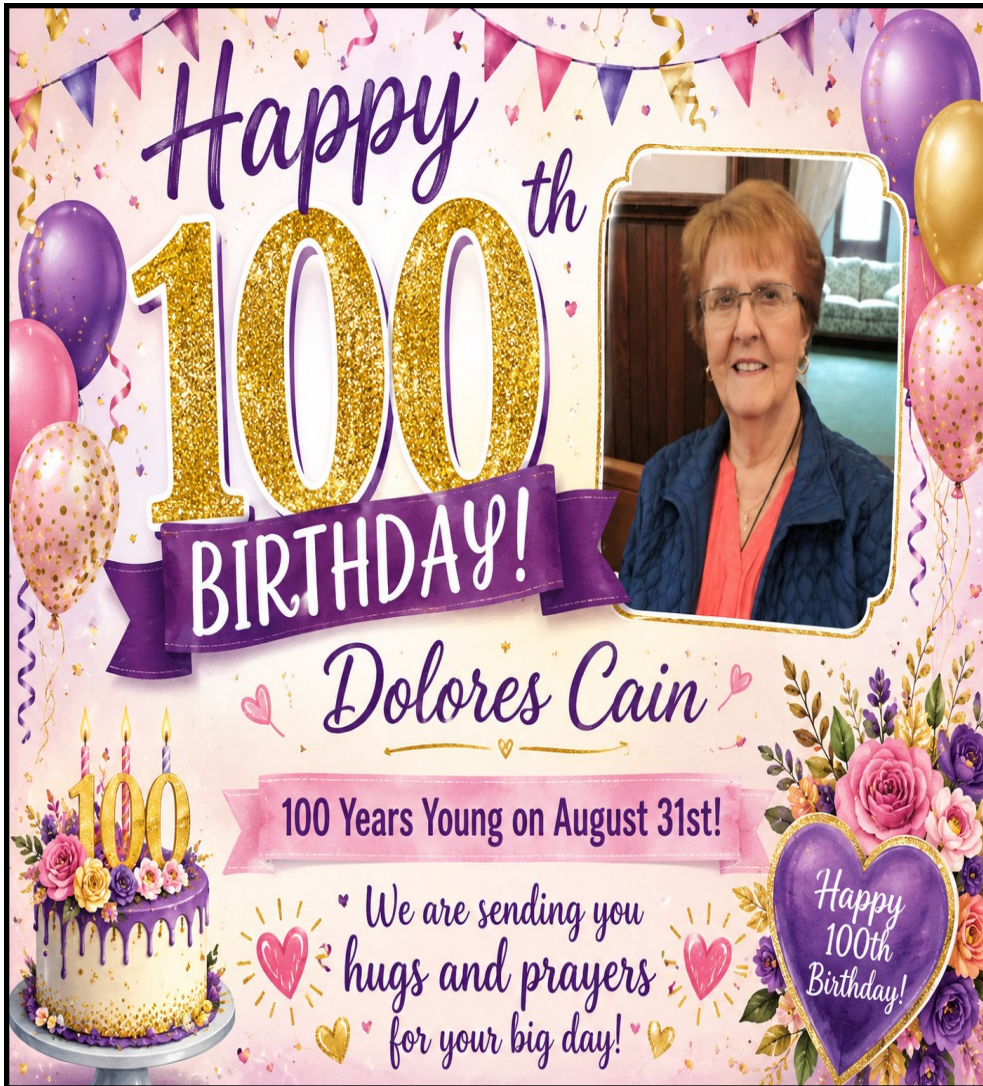
