From the Pastor...

Welcome to Lent 2026 and our Lenten Devotional Journey!



Lent is a season of reflection and preparation, consisting of the 40 days leading up to Easter. It begins on Ash Wednesday, when we are reminded of our mortality – “from the dust and ashes we were born and to dust and ashes we shall return” – and then concludes with the celebration of Jesus’s resurrection.

Lent is generally considered a somewhat solemn, reflective season, corresponding to the short, gray winter days and the long, dark winter nights. There are some branches of the Christian family tree who commemorate Lent by giving something up or making some sort of daily sacrifice in preparation for the sacrifice Jesus made on Good Friday.

But our UCC tradition tends more toward doing something positive, trying something new and Christlike. It’s in that spirit that your Reaching In Team and I are offering you two opportunities to make these 40-days positive and transformational for all of us.

Opportunity 1 – A devotional journey through the Psalms.

The Psalms are a collection of 150 prayers that grew directly out of ancient Israel’s lived experience. Hymns of praise after battle victories; songs of thanksgiving after the blessings of a harvest; cries of lamentation during the reign of a crooked, ungodly king; complaints calling Yahweh into account during long seasons of loss or hardship; and even cries for help when sickness or aging ravage the body, the Psalms cover a lot of emotional ground. They are raw and honest; they are passionate and intense; they are human and often easy to relate to.

The following is a selection of 40 Psalms that we invite you to read throughout Lent at a pace of one per day. You will find a list of several questions to prompt and guide your reflection, and the same 6 questions can be used consistently with each Psalm. In the spirit of our current sermon series, we are hoping you will use these Psalms as portals or entry points, linking your story with the larger story of God in the world. When have you felt the way the writer seems to feel? Who or what is it in our world that is frustrating or angering you, making you want to cry out to God in lament or complaint? Don’t hold back! Tear into these Psalms and allow them to tear into you. If there is one thing the Psalms should teach us it is that we worship a “no-holds-barred” God who can take any emotion that we can dish out.

We hope these Psalms will deepen and enrich not only your 2026 Lenten journey but your faith as well, giving you a way into the long-standing Judeo-Christian tradition of taking everything to God, including the profound political and national fear and frustration that so many of us are feeling in 2026 America.

Opportunity 2 – Four Soup and Bread Suppers with Meditation and Music

These gatherings will take place on four consecutive Wednesday evenings at 5:30 pm. The dates are February 18, 25th, and March 4 and 11th. We’ll begin in the sanctuary at 5:30 for the worship component and then retire to Ransom Hall by 6:00 for soup, bread, and conversation.

How might you jump into this story and respond somehow?

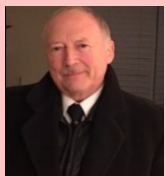
From the Church Council Team...

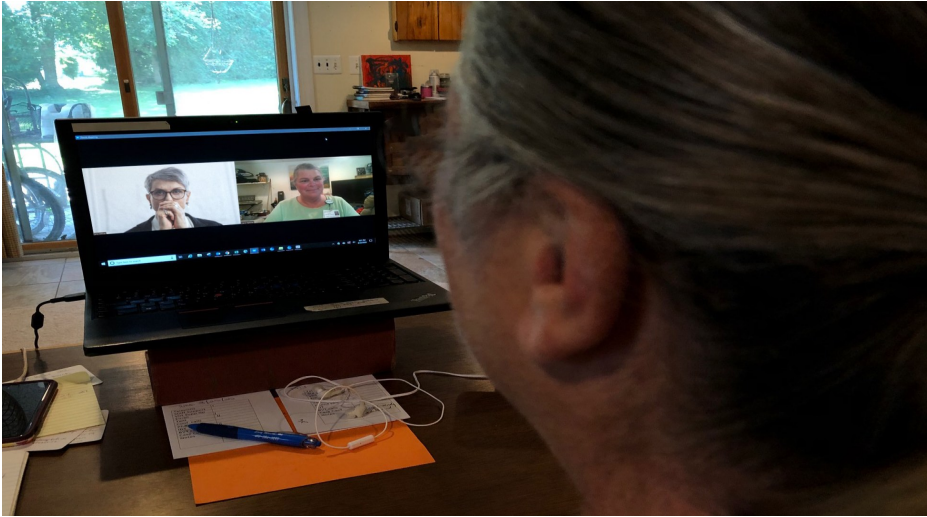
