From the Pastor...

A Theme for A New Year Together...

For centuries and even millennia, we Christians have looked at the scriptures of the Old and New Testament as finished stories that we are to read, remember, and reflect upon. The stories, we assume, have a finished quality to them. They happened centuries ago and bear witness to what our faith ancestors experienced; they are *their* experiences, in other words, NOT ours.

I have come to realize in recent years that this very perspective has everything to do with the utter impotence of Christianity in the modern world. Our children and grandchildren see no value in the repetitious reading of these old, old stories, particularly when they strike them as so improbable and even fanciful.

So, what I am going to ask us to consider together, as 2026 begins, is what if these stories were actually designed to inspire us to live into the on-going narrative of human history? What if these old, old stories are supposed to get us to examine the stories we are living, with an eye toward living a better story than the one we're in? For example, we find ourselves right now in America living a story based on fear – fear of the foreigner and the immigrant, fear of the other political party, fear of scarce resources. As I read the scriptures – and particularly the life and teachings of Jesus – I see people living out hospitality toward foreigners and extending generosity to one another. Thanks to the scriptural narrative, I see that as a superior story and approach to life than the fear-based story our culture is caught in. I am choosing, therefore, to live a better story.

As we enter 2026, I am hoping that we can learn to read and experience the transforming power of scripture by not relegating it to a collection of old, old stories we admire, but rather as an on-going story that we are invited into as full participants in God's on-going action in the world.

We get to choose the story we live. No matter how old we are, if we're still drawing breath, that means there are still blank pages in our life stories. What story do you want to live according to with what remains of your life?

Reaching Out Team: January - February Focus Area

Our Reaching Out Team has chosen to focus on housing scarcity in Charlevoix County because it is directly impacting our city, local businesses, and essential employers. Many workers and service providers are struggling to find stable, affordable housing—an urgent challenge that affects the well-being and long-term sustainability of our entire community.



Alongside outlining the problem, we will also share hopeful and innovative housing solutions, including intentional communities, which offer one promising way to help address and circumvent these challenges.

Theme Lead(s)

The theme will be led by Lisa Copass, with support from the Reaching Out Team.

Planned Activities

- Coffee & Conversation Guest Speaker

- We will welcome a guest speaker who is building an off-the-grid eco-village of self-sustaining, affordable cottages designed for community living. They will share insights into innovative housing solutions and the future of housing in our region.

- Lisa Copass will take us inside her journey of building a Tiny Village for Unhoused Youth, sharing inspiring success stories and the real impact this innovative project has made in the community.

- Ongoing Support: We will continue to support some of the developers building workforce housing, including; John Kurtz (who bought the Timms property on Garfield and Sheridan), David Anderson at 1st Baptist Church in Charlevoix, and CJ Rapp who is working with the counties to zone his land for an intentional community near Mancelona, MI.

- Community Call to Action — Expand Local Housing Options: We invite everyone to reflect on whether you have space that could help ease our community's housing shortage. This could include:

- Building a small backyard cottage (ADU) to rent

- Adding an apartment above or within a garage

- Renting out a spare room in your home

- Converting a home into a duplex with a separate entrance Small additions like these can make a meaningful impact on housing availability in Charlevoix County.

How You Can Get Involved

Participants are encouraged to:

- Attend the Coffee & Conversation speaker session

- Share information or leads on available housing for the resource database

- Explore whether your property could support an additional housing option

- Engage in conversations and invite others who care about the issue
