### FROM THE PASTOR...

Summer in Northern Michigan is such a precious and all-too-brief season, that I always hate to do anything that hastens it along or causes me to miss any of its opportunities. But in our church, summer is also the time when our leaders and ministry teams start to prepare for the next calendar year by setting goals and priorities. Your Council, Trustees, Reaching In, Reaching Out, and Personnel teams are in the process of establishing their ministry focal points for 2026, along with the dollar amounts they're going to need to turn their dreams into reality.

On Sunday, August 10 – both during and after worship – our entire congregation will be celebrating 2025's accomplishments AND sowing seeds of hope for 2026. When the offering plates are passed at that outdoor service, we will not only be placing our weekly offerings in them, but we'll also be dedicating our annual pledges for the 2026 ministry year.

As we approach this crucial crossroads in the life of our congregation, our various ministry teams are working on clear, concise, bulletin-point lists of both what they were able to accomplish in 2025 with your support and what they hope to accomplish in 2026. We'll get those into your hands later this month. But in the meantime, I'd like to highlight just a few of their accomplishments so far this year.

### Council:

- Established 5 Identity Statements
- Hosted a leadership retreat
- Honored outstanding participants
- Developed an organizational flowchart identifying key volunteers and their back-ups

### Trustees:

- Re-roofed the church, paid down the roof debt
- Made significant technological upgrades and are implementing a plan to replace one staff computer per year
- Purchased a new water heater
- Made significant improvements to all bathrooms
- Purchased a battery-powered lawn mower, saving the church hundreds per year

### **Reaching In:**

- Planned and led several incredible study groups
- Expanded/improved congregational care
- Developed a comprehensive emergency communication plan for the entire church
- Worked with Toby & Shelley on bringing outstanding music to our worship services

### **Reaching Out:**

- Hosted affordable housing summit
- Established a partnership with Guatemala
- Established a volunteer host team
- Established an outreach to the incarcerated
- Began a support initiative for migrants, immigrants, & temporary/guest workers

### Personnel:

- Reviewed/updated all employee contracts
- Worked with Toby to evaluate all employees
- Met with Toby and evaluated him
- Began a succession plan for our custodian

As you can see, all of our ministry teams have been extremely productive on our behalf. I hope you'll make it a point to thank your fellow participants for all they've done in 2025. And, even better than your verbal expressions of thanks would be for you to increase your pledge to the church for 2026, for it is your tithes and offerings that will enable these volunteer teams to plant even more seeds of hope next year than they did this year.

If you are a new participant, you may not be familiar with our annual pledging process. Every year — usually in late August or early September — we ask every participant to make a financial commitment to the church for the next calendar year. Your pledge is a dollar amount that we can count on receiving from you over the course of the year that will help us fund our ministry priorities. While some may think, "I don't want to pledge because there are too many unknowns in my life right now," the church simply can't operate without knowing the income we will receive from our participants. A pledge is not a contract; it is an intention. Life happens, and, yes, sometimes people can't quite come up with their pledged dollar amount. We all understand that, but setting an intention for the year where your church family is concerned is one concrete way to express your gratitude and to help our trustees more effectively manage the budget year by year.

We are anticipating a budget in the neighborhood of \$310,000 to sow seeds of hope in 2026. With approximately 100 regular participants, that works out to an average annual pledge of \$3100 per person. Of course, many of us pledge more than that, which is great, while others of us can't quite reach that threshold. But if we all do our best and partner with the Holy Spirit in this vital endeavor, we believe it will all work out.

Thank you all so very much for ALL you have done to make 2025 such a fantastic year for our church with the purple doors. I couldn't be any prouder of this amazing church family. It is a genuine privilege to serve as your pastor.



Our community will be looking for more opportunities for developing year round workforce housing that would benefit employers, employees, and the Charlevoix area.
